Paris City Commission 525 High Street Paris, KY 40361 Meeting Minutes October 22, 2019

The Paris City Commission met in regular session in the City Commission Chambers at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, October 22, 2019.

Mayor, Johnny Plummer called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

City Clerk, Stephanie Settles conducted roll call.

Upon determining a quorum was present for the transaction of business, Assistant City Manager Mike Withrow, proceeded to conduct the meeting.

Public Comment

Beka Schwartz was introduced to the Commission as the new CASA Volunteer Manager for Bourbon County. Approve Minutes

Motion by Galbraith, seconded by Allen-Edwards, approving the minutes of October 8, 2019 regular meeting. Motion carried by roll call vote of 4-0 with Allen-Edwards, Galbraith, Perraut, and Plummer voting Aye.
