Paris City Commission 525 High Street Paris, KY 40361 Meeting Minutes September 22, 2020

Pursuant to KRS 61.826 and OAG 20-05, the state of emergency regarding the threats to public health presented by the novel coronavirus (covid-19) pandemic and municipal order. This meeting of the Paris city commission was conducted by videoconference. The Paris City Commission met in special session at 6:02 p.m. viewable on Facebook live at <u>www.facebook.com/cityofparisky/</u> on Tuesday, September 22, 2020.

Mayor, John Plummer called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

City Clerk, Stephanie Settles conducted roll call.

Present: Mayor, John A. Plummer; Commissioner, Matt Perraut; Commissioner; Wallis Brooks; Commissioner, Stan Galbraith; Commissioner, Anna Allen-Edwards.

Others in Attendance: City Manager, Daron Jordan; City Attorney, Bryan Beauman

Upon determining a quorum was present for the transaction of business, City Manager, Daron Jordan proceeded to conduct the meeting.

Approve Minutes

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Plummer approving the minutes of September 8, 2020 regular meeting. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.

Old Business

Second reading of an ordinance providing a 2% discount to 2020 real property taxes was read by Daron Jordan. Motion by Brooks, seconded by Perraut, approving ordinance 2020-11 providing a 2% discount to 2020 real property taxes paid on or before November 25, 2020 by 4:30 p.m. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.

CITY OF PARIS ORDINANCE 2020-11

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING DISCOUNT TO REAL PROPERTY TAX

Whereas, the City has previously adopted Ordinance No. established the ad valorem tax to be calculated and due for real property in the City, and

Whereas, KRS 91A.070(2)(d) permits the City to establish by ordinance a discount for early payment of ad valorem taxes;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARIS CITY COMMISSION AS FOLLOWS:

The Board of Commissioners of the City of Paris desires to allot for a discount for the early payment of ad valorem taxes on real property. Any 2020 real property ad valorem tax that is paid in full on or before November 25, 2020 shall be discounted by the amount of two percent (2%). In order to qualify for the discount under this Ordinance, the entire discounted payment must be received by the City at its Municipal Building, 525 High Street, no later than 4:30 p.m. November 25, 2020.

One bid for the 2020 Street resurfacing project was received by Hinkle Contracting for \$ 224,905.00. It was decided the city manager would discuss options with Hinkle to reduce the cost.

Motion by Allen-Edwards, seconded by Brooks, approving a 10% rental rate increase to the Commonwealth of KY for office space on the 2nd floor of the City municipal building for a period of July 1, 2021 thru June 30, 2022. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.

Brad Oberlander CPA discussed outstanding utility bills. No action was taken.

City Manager Daron Jordan reminded everyone of the public hearing scheduled for Friday, September 25, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. to levy the 2020 property and tangible taxes, along with the 2021 motor vehicle taxes.

City Manager Daron Jordan shared that Paris Independent Schools has agreed that the city can use the auditorium for community workshops to address homelessness and police department processes. Meeting dates and times will be shared once they are arranged.

Motion by Plummer, seconded by Perraut, authorizing the Mayor, City Manager and Commissioner Galbraith to continue to work with KYTC by purchasing and replacing lateral water lines during the Main and High Street project. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Perraut, approving to demolish the Atlas Street property. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.

Commissioner Allen-Edwards discussed that CSX had blasted the excess loose hanging concrete from the 14th Street underpass. CSX is expecting to improve the aesthetics and spray the concrete underneath by the end of October. CSX stated they felt the underpass was safe for traffic and pedestrians to cross once again.

New Business

Motion by Allen-Edwards, seconded by Plummer, approving the Transfer Station to open on the first and third Saturday of each month from 7:00 am to 4:00 pm. to begin November 7, 2020. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.

Motion by Galbraith, seconded by Perraut, approving the closure of the 19th Street Recycling Center location allowing future recyclables to be taken and accepted at the transfer station. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Perraut, approving the reimbursement of 911-meter fees to the following accounts. 15-038450-01; 91-900600-00; 91-902630-01; 91-900695-02; 91-899110-00; 91-899120-00;15-034200-00. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Galbraith, approving a contingent hire upon applicants passing a drug screen and final interview with the City Manager of Justin Crump and Clayton Sears as full-time laborers and medium equipment operators for the public works department. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.

Motion by Perraut, seconded by Plummer, approving Trick-or-Treating on Saturday, October 31st from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Citizens may choose to participate and follow COVID guidelines set by the local health department. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.

Motion by Brooks, seconded by Galbraith, approving August financials as presented by Brad Oberlander, reflecting General Fund Revenues of \$ 2,020,633.00 with expenditures of \$ 859,398.00 Utility Fund Revenues of \$ 1,808,257.00 with expenditures of \$ 1,627,617.00. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Perraut, Brooks, Allen-Edwards, and Galbraith voting Aye.
