Paris City Commission 525 High Street Paris, KY 40361 Meeting Minutes November 23, 2021

The Paris City Commission met in regular session at 9:00 a.m. viewable on Facebook live at www.facebook.com/cityofparisky on Tuesday, November 23, 2021.

Mayor, Plummer called the meeting to order, and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

City Clerk Stephanie Settles conducted roll call.

Present: Mayor, John Plummer Commissioner, Wallis Brooks; Commissioner, Holli Gibson; Commissioner, Stan Galbraith; Commissioner, Angela Roberts.

Others in Attendance: Interim City Manager, Mike Withrow; City Attorney, Bryan Beauman; CPA, Brad Oberlander; and City Clerk, Stephanie Settles.

Upon determining a quorum was present for the transaction of business, Interim City Manager Mike Withrow proceeded to conduct the meeting.

Approval of Minutes

Motion by Plummer, seconded by Brooks, to approve the regular meeting minutes of the November 9, 2021, meeting. Motion carried by roll call vote of 5-0 with Plummer, Brooks, Roberts, Galbraith, and Gibson voting Aye.

Presentation

Mark Burden Director of the Bluegrass Narcotics Taskforce discussed that the taskforce recently completed a 40 person round up within two counties. Mark stated the taskforce main priority is Heroin, Fentanyl, Methamphetamine, and Crack that trafficking takes priority. Marks stated that drug overdoses are on the rise and fentanyl is responsible for 70% of the overdoses. Mark reiterated the taskforce and all local law enforcement agencies are actively offering help and resources to those addicted.

New Business

Frances Richie with Rumpke Waste & Recycling discussed their request to renew the current sanitation services contract. Mike Withrow had previously requested for an extension of the contract allowing the city time to put into place a permanent city manager. Frances stated Rumpke would not grant the city the extension because Rumpke has not had a rate increase since 2018, and if the contract is only approved for a few months the rates would go back to the drawing board and the current proposed rate may not be available and likely be higher than what is currently proposed because the rate is now public. The commission reiterated to Frances that the data was presented to them last evening and was not fair to expect a decision with less than 24 hours to review the proposal. The current contract expires on November 30, 2021.

Motion by Mayor, seconded by Brooks, to accept the Rumpke proposal instructing the city attorney to draft an amendment to the current contract for the mayor's signature. Motion carried by roll call vote of 4-1 with Plummer, Brooks, Gibson, and Galbraith voting Aye. Roberts voting Nay.

The commission tasked Brad with preparing information as to the costs associated with paying essential pay, taxes, withholdings etc. and submit a cost analysis for review to the commission at the next meeting.

Brad Oberlander and Erin Morton discussed the PayScale and classification, the discussion appeared that more review was needed with the scale and was moved to the December 6, 2021, workshop meeting for further discussion.

- The city manager search has been paired down to 12 applicants. Zoom interviews began on November 23, 2021. The commission will review the applicants on December 6th and narrow down to 4 to interview.

Commissioner, Angela Roberts

- 25 homeless initiative bags have been collected. Next zoom meeting is scheduled for December 1, 2021, inviting everyone to reach out and participate.
 - o Chief Thomas reiterated that there are 50-75 homeless in the area.
 - Commissioner Gibson requested the city to put a note on the next utility bill that collections are being accepted for the homeless initiative bags. Mike Withrow stated he would get with Cassie to include on the next bill, they are limited to characters and space on the bills, but it can be done.
- Voyage Movement is starting a winter weekly meal at Paris Highschool cafeteria beginning December 4, 2021, ending in March, open to anyone in need of a meal.

Commissioner, Wallis Brooks

- Requested a couple officers to attend Sunday, November 27 at 10:30 a.m. the 7th Street church will be holding a Shop with a Cop program.
- Expressed his concern with the recent payroll issue where employees did not get paid on time.
 - o Mike Withrow stated when he received the email at 3:30 p.m., he immediately got online to transfer payroll and received an error that said the time had expired, to set up a new date and the next date was a holiday, and the banks were closed.
 - Commissioner Gibson discussed she contacted Traditional Bank and they explained the process of approval/transferring payroll and it needed to be completed by 4:00 p.m. reiterating that someone needs to reach out to Traditional Bank because if the funds were approved to transfer before 4:00 p.m. then the bank needs to be notified because that's an issue if it was completed at 3:30.
 - Erin Morton stated that the mayor gave the bank authorization to reverse all the packets and they processed a same day ACH
 request most employees were paid before 9:45 that morning, only the employees that banked with Stockyards was delayed the
 longest.

The commission agreed that a backup needs to be in place to ensure this doesn't occur again.

Expressed his appreciation for Betty Ann Allen for her commitment and representing the City of Paris at multiple events on Saturday November 20, 2021. Commissioner Gibson echoed the appreciation stating that Laure Biddle and Betty Ann Allen show a lot of enthusiasm and represent the city well.
